Furthermore there's an issue of funds for transport, most home teams have difficulty of bringing players to the games and can only bring those with money or a little bit of finance whereas the players they leave behind are some of the players that would develop way faster and be able to play a better basketball. Coaches and team managers at times try to pay for transportation of the players but as an adult, you have things that needs to be taken care of which at times lead to not having money to transport the players.
